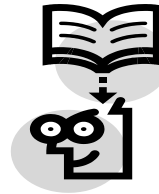
Disciple Bible Study

A New-Old Project

It has been several years since WE have properly maintained the 2 elevated planters in front of the church. They used to have shrubs in them based on pictures on old church directories.

The church Board of Trustees has recently considered having them torn down or replaced. I have volunteered to direct the effort to keep and upgrade them.

My hope and intention is to repair and plant them to all flowering perennials.

Jim Macintyre has agreed to install a timed automatic watering system which is critical as they are both under the eave overhang of the church and they get very little rain.

I am hoping volunteers will help with the following projects. We should have the planters ready for planting by mid-September. We do have a budget set by the Trustees so we can buy materials.

- 1) Carpenters to build treated wood steps to safely get to each planter.
- 2) Masons to clean and re-mortar the 3 areas where the planters are leaning away from the church to stop leakage. Also they could drill holes to remove the excess water.
- 3) Builders to design and install exterior wing walls (or buttresses) to hopefully prevent the planter walls from moving any more away from the church.
- 4) Gardeners to add topsoil, prepare the ground for planting, and plant the new plants. These volunteers could help prepare a Planting Plan.

I have asked the garden committee to submit plant information from dividing present perennials in the Memorial Garden. (perennials should be divided every 4-5 years anyway). Anyone who has really good perennials that we might use may also let me know.

God's Country Cooperative Parish Mission Trip June 19 thru 24, 2011

First we want to thank the congregation for the spiritual and financial assistance for our successful mission trip. Your Christian love was felt by each one of us. The "crew" consisted of: Richard and Nancy Inman, Doug and Sheryl Hubbell, Dave Hickman, Dalton Huey and Jim Macintyre. We all camped at Tahquamenon State park, Rivermouth Campground. For Richard and Nancy it was "old home week" as they spent 5 weeks last year working in the cooperative. Dave had spent a week aiding the team last year, the rest of us were "newcomers". For that week we were all transformed from "Trolls" to Honorary "Yoopers". Our base of operations was from the Paradise UMC. Our Sunday night indoctrination was in the Hulbert UMC. That is when we received the locations and scope of just where and what we would be working on starting Monday morning. We were given two locations so our group started out being separated into two groups. Richard and Nancy, Dave and Dalton were to be working in a home adding drywall to two bedrooms as well as addressing some insulation problems. Doug, Sheryl and I were to build a wheelchair ramp at another home. Each of our groups were assigned an Intern by the coordinator for GCCP, Katie Peterson. They were to assist with our daily devotions as well as coordination in insuring adequate supplies were on hand. In the 4½ half days of work the following was accomplished: Insulation replaced as needed, all walls of the two bedrooms were dry walled, mudded, sanded and primed ready for finish paint. All this while working around numerous obstacles and dismantling beds, cleaning up and reassembling beds daily. Other obstacles were a large washer and dryer and a hot water heater. On Thursday morning a water leak required repair by the team as well. The ramp team started with the aid of a Hulbert UMC member, Jim Snody, who had been to the site and had much of the materials there. As more materials were required Jim or Katie made sure

they were on site. The ramp was completed in just over two days despite the rain and the UP vultures, (mosquitoes). The ramp team moved to the other home and re-roofed a large pump house and then moved inside to start the task of adding paneling to the bathroom walls. The team feels that we were able to accomplish everything asked of us in our stay and perhaps even a bit more. The two families we were able to assist were very pleased and grateful for our services. Two people were able to get out of their homes without family members needing to lift them from the porch. The other family had drywall up for the first time in nearly 20 years as well as a start in finishing the bathroom. Richard and Nancy had worked on the drywall project last year by installing it in the bathroom for the first time since the house was built.

On Monday Night we were treated to a wonderful Chicken dinner by the Hulbert UMC. We were all well fed and had good Christian fellowship. The total membership of Hulbert UMC had increased on that Sunday to 7. They had just accepted two new members on the 19th. The dinner was a sort of celebration for them as well. It is a beautiful log Church with a magnificent stone chimney. It is very well kept and in a good location. Visit it the next time you are in the area and attend if you are there on a Sunday. On Tuesday and Wednesday our group had potluck dinners and fellowship. On Thursday Katie had a Pasty dinner for us at the Paradise UMC followed by Fellowship. Paradise UMC is also a very nice Church. It is much newer and has a fellowship hall. It would be good to visit and attend there as well.

Our team was one of four working in the area that week, so much was accomplished for the Cooperative. It is a wonderful mission to be able to help those right here in Michigan. It has been uplifting to donate skills and time to help our Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

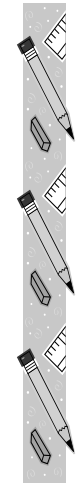

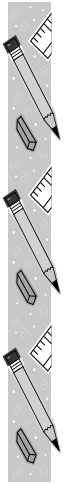
